

Terrace courtyard offers a sanctuary from busy city

WHEN Arron and Jenna Clarke first saw their Enmore home in 2012, they knew straight away that it was the perfect place for them.

"We loved the house because it was so sunny and light," Mrs Clarke said.

Mr Clarke added: "It was quite liveable but we could picture the floorplan of what we wanted and three years on we have renovated it to exactly how we like it."

Originally a two-bedroom, one bathroom terrace, the couple transformed it into a three-bedroom abode with two bathrooms.

The two-storey home has a modern

design with oak floors, an open-plan Caesarstone kitchen and living area that flows out to a covered entertainment deck.

"We wanted it to be functional as an entertaining house as well as a family home," Mrs Clarke said.

The outdoor space has a pizza oven and landscaped gardens.

"Our courtyard gets so much sunlight. It's got a green leafy outlook. It's a nice escape from the city," Mrs Clarke said.
