NEGLECTED NEWTOWN COTTAGE FETCHES \$135,000 MORE THAN ITS RESERVE, WRITES GEORGIA BROWN

DDING to the growing list of rundown homes in the inner west selling for stellar prices, a neglected three-bedroom house in Newtown sold for \$1.735 million at auction over the weekend.

The owner was an investor who bought the property in 2014 for \$1 million, and initially rented it out to students before going through a DA process. Apart from the DA approval, no changes had been made to the property over the three years.

The auction of the 2-4 Angel St home saw five parties register to bid and two of those compete for the house.

Bidding started at \$1.4 million before the property sold under the hammer for \$135,000 over the reserve price. The winning bidders were a family from Newtown who plan to renovate the property.

Selling agent Jack Parry of BresicWhitney - Balmain saw about 90 groups through the home during the campaign.

"Both the raw aspect of the house and the DA approval were the reasons for the hotly contested auction," Mr Parry said.

GARDEN DELIGHT

A GARDEN apartment in Newtown has proved to be a popular investment after one investor bought it from another at auction over the weekend.

The auction of the one-bedroom home at 14/20 Fitzgerald St drew a crowd of 25 onlookers while two of the three registered bidders went head to head.
